

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

OF

THOMAS MORRISON

In the name of God Amen. December ye 29 day 1746
 Being sick and near unto Death as appears unto me but in perfect
 sense and memory, first of all I commit my soul unto God who
 gave it and my body to be buried in a decent manner, nothing
 doubting but it shall be resurrected at the general judgment at
 the last day. As...(to)...my worldly substance that God has
 been pleased to bestow on me, I dispose of form and manner
 following.

First, I desire that my debts be discharged out of the whole
 estate. I allow that my wife and children may live together on
 the place if they can manage it and if they cannot I allow my
 Executor to dispose of it to the best advantage and I allow my
 dear wife to have one third part of my whole estate and effects.
 I allow the rest of my estate to be equally divided amongst my
 children, only ten pounds to be taken of the whole of the
 children's part and given my son John. I allow Samuel Sturgin
 and John Shields to be my whole and sole Executors of this my
 last will and testament as witness my hand and seal the day and
 year above mentioned.
